- The original Engineer's Report estimated the costs for the overall Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) master improvements at roughly \$106 million; it includes spine roads, off-site utility connection fees and a small number of stormwater site improvements.
- The CIP was not changed much. It contemplates adding additional properties into the Master CDD, the CDD financing the entire CIP and that all the land brought into the CDD boundary will benefit from the CIP.
 - The Boundary Amendment envisions 2,257 additional planned units and that the commercial acreage is still an open item.
 - Mr. Frye asked if the maximum bond amount takes into account the total units of 7,002 as shown in the Chart on Page 1. Mr. Earlywine replied affirmatively.

On MOTION by Mr. Caputo and seconded by Mr. Frye, with all in favor, the Master Engineer's Report dated March 13, 2023, in substantial form for the purposes of bond validation, was approved.
